

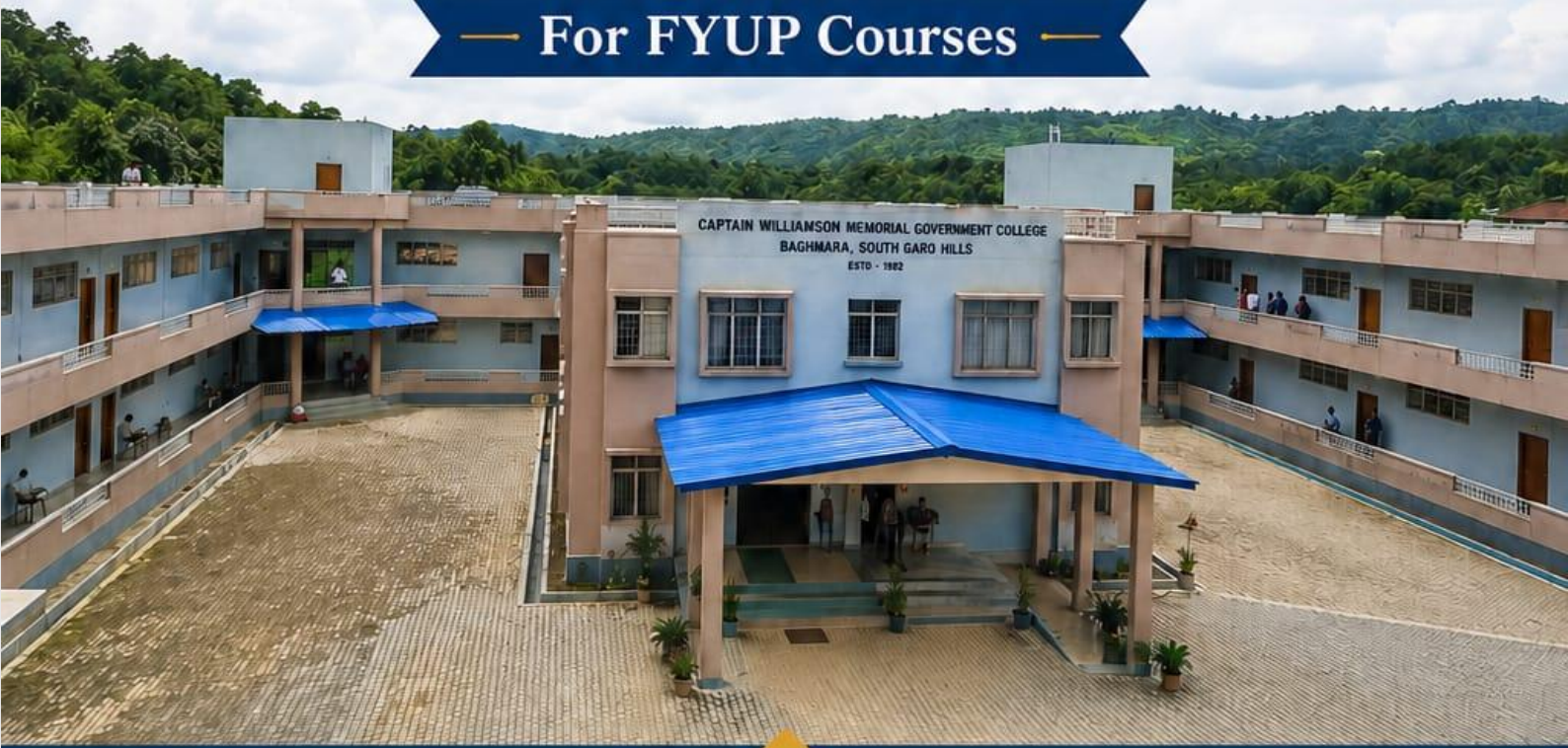

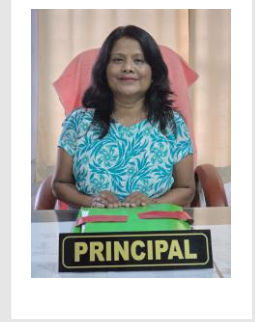

COLLEGE PROFILE

Captain Williamson Memorial Government College was established in June, 1992. The chief architects who had conceived the idea to establish the College were Late Lotsing A. Sangma, the then Local MLA and also Minister of Meghalaya, Shri P.S. Thangkhiew, I.A.S, the then Deputy Commissioner of South Garo Hills District, Shri Jeffrey D Sangma, M.C.S, the then Block Development Officer, Baghmara Development Block and other prominent citizens of Baghmara. The College was inaugurated on 23rd September, 1993 by Shri. Salseng C. Marak, the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Meghalaya.

Initially the College was functioning in the Town Committee Hall of Baghmara with 21 students in the evening shift with Dr. Donberd Sangma as Principal and along with two other part-time lecturers namely, Shri Dillip Kr. Saha, Retd. Principal, Rangku Memorial Girls' Higher Secondary School and Shri S. K. Dubey, Assistant teacher of Jawahar. Novadaya Vidyalaya, Baghmara until the college was shifted to its present building on 6th June 1997. The college got Permanent Affiliation for the Degree in Bachelor of Arts with honours from the North Eastern Hill University, Shillong in August, 2007-2008.

PROGRAMME OFFERED

- a) There shall be three or four-year undergraduate programmes in different disciplines.
- b) The three-year undergraduate programmes shall be leading to a Bachelor's degree in single Major or Multidisciplinary programmes.
- c) The four years undergraduate program shall be leading to a Bachelor's degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research).
- d) In this academic session 2026-2027, college is offering 3-years or 4-years degree with Honours only, in course of time college may include 4-years degree Honours with research, subject to availability of qualified faculty in the respective subjects and required infrastructure as specified by NEHU.

PROGRAMME DURATION

The duration of the undergraduate programmes shall be three or four years evenly spread over six or eight semester, respectively, with exit and re-entry options.

ELEGIBILITY CRITERIA

- a) A candidate must obtain a Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary Certificate on successful completion of Grade 12 examination or any other equivalent examination from any recognized Board of Secondary Education.
- b) Admission process shall be based on marks/scores in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) or any other authorized agency approved by the University.
- c) Admission to the second, third and fourth-academic year of a program shall be given to those candidates existing the program after the first, second and third academic year, respectively. Admission criteria shall be notified by the college authority in the college notice board, college website, etc.
- d) Students securing at least 75% marks in aggregate on completion of the third academic year shall be eligible for a 4-year degree program in Honours with Research. Students securing less than 75% shall be eligible for undertaking Honours only.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. All candidates are required to apply and submit their applications exclusively through the official MCAP portal at mcap.nic.in.
2. Applicants will be selected for admission on the basis of merit list as per CUET score.
3. For non-CUET students, college conduct an entrance test and selection will be based on the basis of merit.
4. Non -CUET candidates also must apply online through MCAP portal.
5. Applicants, parents, and guardians should refer the college prospectus before applying.
6. The students have to fill up their personal details, choice of colleges, honours subjects and upload required certificates in MCAP portal.
7. The students have to pay Rs. 200/- for filling online forms in MCAP portal.
8. Selected candidates will receive a confirmation e-mail and after that they block the confirmed seat on payment of Rs. 1000/-. The remaining amount of admission fee the students have to pay during final admission in the college after physical verification of original certificate etc.

9. The college cannot bear any responsibility for an applicant who does not have the university required norms and through oversight has been admitted to the course.
10. In case of withdrawal of admission, fees shall be refunded as per the UGC instruction D.O. No. F.2-1/2022(CPP-II) dated 3rd July 2023. A candidate seeking a refund must apply for it stating a reason for withdrawal and no re-admission will be granted.
11. A few seats are reserved for differently able students.
12. Admission will be based as per NEHU Guidelines 2026 for all colleges affiliated to NEHU.

DOCUMENTS FOR APPLICATION

(a) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE APPLICATION FOR PROVISIONAL SELECTION:

- (I) A scan copy of a recent passport-size photograph of the applicant.
- (II) A scan copy of the class X and class XII marksheet.
- (III) A scan copy of the Aadhar card (in case the applicant does not possess one, kindly obtain the same before the session starts)
- (IV) A scan copy of the ST/SC/OBC/PH certificate (if applicable) issued by competent authority.
- (V) A scan copy of birth certificate.

(b) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE APPLICATION FOR FINAL SELECTION:

- (I) A copy of the class XII marksheet.
- (II) A copy of the CUET UG 2026 score card.

Note: Online Application without the required documents will not be considered.

(c) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THE COLLEGE OFFICE FOR UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION:

- (a) Hard copy of the online Application Form.
- (b) Original marksheet of class X.
- (c) Original marksheet of class XII.
- (d) Original downloaded CUET UG 2026 score card.
- (e) Original ST/SC/OBC/certificate (if applicable)
- (f) A character Certificate from the Principal of the school/college last attended.
- (g) The ORIGINAL MIGRATION CERTIFICATE for applicants coming from Boards/ Universities other than the Meghalaya Board of School Education is to be handed over to the office not later than one month from the date of commencement of the First Semester.
- (h) The College encourages applicants with disabilities to enroll. Such applicants are required to produce a Disability Certificate duly issued by a competent authority.

Note:

- The ORIGINAL marksheets of Class X and XII is NOT to be handed to the office under any circumstances.
- Applicants who do not have all the required documents will not be able to register for University Examinations.
- The students have to submit xerox and self-attested copy of all certificates at the time of admission.

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020

With the introduction of the NEP 2020 in the country, we are glad that North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) has implemented the same, starting in August 2023. This is a bold move by the University, which gives the students a plethora of academic and non-academic, skill-based learning.

COURSES OF STUDY

- The college conducts undergraduate course which are affiliated to North-Eastern Hill University in Bachelor of Arts. The college will follow the North-Eastern Hill University guidelines.
- The duration of the Degree Course is eight semesters which is equivalent to 4 years.
- The college holds semester examinations as per the University schedule. After the completion of each semester, the student continues in the next semester after due registration.
- The Degree courses in the Colleges are full-time courses. There are no provisions for “Private” or “Part-Time” or “Non-collegiate candidates”.

COLLEGE HOSTELS

1. The college also maintains hostel facilities for the benefit of out-station students who come from far off rural areas.
2. The college currently has a Boys hostel with a capacity of 15 boys and a Girls' Hostel accommodating 26 girls.
3. Those wishing to apply for a Hostel seat may collect the admission form from the college office.
4. While meeting the warden, the applicant should be accompanied by parent and the local guardian.
5. Hostel admission is provided on the basis of merit and distance of area from where the student belongs.
6. The pupils are expected to maintain discipline and a feeling of fraternity with one another in the hostel and the community at large.

ATTENDANCE

- According to UGC Regulation, a student requires a minimum of 75% Attendance. A student having less than the required percentage of attendance is liable to be barred from appearing for the University Examinations.
- For better communication, a student from outside Baghmara must have a local guardian and they will have to come to the college when they are called.

ANTI-RAGGING

Ragging of freshers/juniors in many institutions is a matter of social concern. Ragging in any form (physical, Verbal and Mental) is totally prohibited in this institution. Anyone found guilty of ragging and /or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively is liable to be punished in accordance with the "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009". Every student is expected to register online in the Anti-Ragging Cell under UGC and submit a copy of the undertaking Registration form to their respective Department Heads.

Our institution is free from ragging. However, there is an Anti-Ragging Cell in place, comprising senior students and teachers in-charge. Members of this cell are always vigilant that no ragging to freshers / juniors occurs in the college Campus or Hostels. Hostel wardens are empowered to take action against students indulging in ragging as per the UGC regulations. The principal of the college shall act immediately in response to the information received from the Anti-Ragging Cell.
